Updates

PAL Updates

On November 5th, following the tabling of Budget 2025, <u>IRCC announced</u> the following in relation to Provincial Attestation Letters (PALS):

- Effective January 1, 2026, international master's and doctoral students at public universities will be exempt from the PAL requirement. We are awaiting confirming on the impact of these changes (if any) to PGD, graduate certificate, and visiting research students.
- IRCC will process study permit applications from outside Canada at the doctoral level within 14 days, including accompanying family members.
- IRCC launched a <u>new webpage</u> for graduate-degree audiences, consolidating information on special measures, work-permit eligibility, PGWP access, and permanent residence pathways to better inform prospective students.

We will be sure to share additional information/details regarding these changes, particularly related to the updated PAL requirement, as soon as it becomes available.

Graduate Courses Taken Outside the Program of Studies

Thesis/project-based master's or doctoral students are required to pay tuition at the appropriate posted rate for any graduate-level course(s) taken outside their program of study (POS). Please follow the steps below to notify CGPS and ensure that the student's tuition is assessed properly:

- 1. Academic unit will <u>submit a ticket</u> to the CGPS Service Desk indicating that a student is/is planning to take a graduate-level course outside their POS. Please provide all relevant information, including student name, BID, course number, and CRN.
- 2. CGPS will determine what program/tuition rate the course falls under based on the relevant program listing in the catalogue and will work with the Registrar's Office to ensure that updates are made to the student account, if necessary.
- 3. CGPS will notify the student of any updates to their account.
