Funding

Tri-Agency Scholarship Program | Master's Level

Tri-Agency is the umbrella term used to describe the three Canadian government scholarship funding agencies:

- Canadian Institutes of Health Research (CIHR)
- Natural Sciences and Engineering Research Council (NSERC)
- Social Sciences and Humanities Research Council (SSHRC)

Students can apply for the appropriate Tri-Agency scholarship before and during their graduate program.

- \$27,000 for 12 months | <u>CGRS-M (Canada Graduate Research Scholarship Master's Program)</u> + recipients get a one-time \$5,000 supplement
- Applications for Master's level applications are due December 1, 2025.

Indigenous scholars are fast-tracked to the final rounds of adjudication.
