Updates to GPS 210

An updated version of the GPS 210 Progress Report form was approved at the November 2025 CGPS Faculty Council meeting. The <u>updated form</u> is available online now in both PDF and Word format, and units are encouraged to begin using this form as soon as possible. **Effective May 1, 2026, all submitted progress reports must follow the new format.**

Units and programs can continue to use their own departmental progress forms beyond May 1, 2026, provided they include at a minimum the questions/sections included in the new GPS 210.

SIS is working on updates to the Graduate Services page in PAWS to account for these recent updates to the Progress Report. Further information will be shared as soon as those updates are complete.

International Tuition Deposit Update

With the removal of the PAL requirement for incoming international master's and doctoral students, we will also be **removing the international tuition deposit requirement**, **effective January 1, 2026.**

Students who have previously paid a deposit will still have that amount credited to their tuition account. All previously-paid deposits will follow the refund processes currently in place. This change has no impact on any deposits collected by individual programs.

Visiting Research Students (VRS) Reminders

All VRS must maintain continuous registration during their time at USask. Incoming VRS are asked to present themselves at CGPS upon arrival to initiate this process.

If a VRS arrives at your office and has not yet been registered by CGPS staff in the XVRS course, please remind them to come to the CGPS office (THORV 116) for assistance. Please do not register VRS within the department. Furthermore, VRS are not able to enroll in any courses other than the XVRS course. If they wish to pursue any other coursework, they will need to apply and register through an alternate pathway.

Pausing Graduate Professional Skills Certificate

The Graduate Professional Skills Certificate (GPS 974/984) will be paused effective **May 1**, **2026.**

Replacing the certificate is CGPS' ongoing professional skills modules and centralized suite of offerings - tailored, timely, and designed for graduate students. Offerings as they become available are listed on the <u>LevelUP PD dashboard</u>, <u>Beyond the Professoriate</u> <u>platform</u>, as well as the Pro Skills Canvas page.
