Graduate Professional Skills Certificate | Register for Winter 2025

The <u>Graduate Professional Skills Certificate</u> is a non-credit program for graduate students and postdoctoral fellows from all colleges and schools, focusing on strengths-based professional skills and development. The certificate program is offered at no cost.

The certificate requires you to complete two courses and demonstrate evidence of building your professional skills. The courses should be taken either at the same time or in this order:

 GPS 984: Thinking Critically - This highly interactive non-credit course provides a supportive and challenging setting for you to uncover and explore personal and professional beliefs and values as you candidly explore diverse issues with peers from various disciplines. GPS 974: Graduate Professional Skills Certificate - This is an umbrella course for the
certificate that supports you with setting goals in alignment with a recognized set of
professional skills. You must register for GPS 974 to join the certificate program and
remain registered until you complete your portfolio and perform a final demonstration
of your skills.

Required courses are offered both online and in-person. Register in the course format that best accommodates your schedule and learning style. To register, use the **Registration** channel in PAWS.

Kayla was born raised near Humboldt, Saskatchewan, and is an urban member of Biigtigong Nishanaabeg in Ontario. Kayla's thesis research orginated from a project with the City of Saskatoon, where she identified biases embedded in language within job descriptions.

By integrating Indigenous perspectives within the field of management, Kayla's work challenges Eurocentric assumptions, decolonizes management knowledge, and fosters more inclusive organizational practices. These
