# French Embassy of Canada | Applications open to support French-Canadian scientific cooperation

The cooperation service of the French Embassy in Canada has opened two calls for applications to support French-Canadian scientific cooperation in 2025:

- The Mourou/Strickland program, for tenure-track researchers from France and from Canada (outside Quebec), provides seed grants to encourage new bilateral cooperation in all disciplines. The scholarship includes a round-trip flight Canada to France and a contribution towards subsistence costs. The call for applications is open until January 26, 2025. Apply now.
- High Level Scientific Fellowship program, for PhD candidates and postdocs working in Canadian universities (outside Quebec), offers scholarships to foster research mobility to France. The aim of this program is to facilitate and strengthen collaboration with academic researchers, working in priority in the following fields: Emerging Technologies (AI, quantum, etc.), Health (One Health, public health policy, genomics, etc.), Ocean and Polar Sciences (oceanography, biodiversity, marine ecology, etc.) Energy (renewable energy, net zero transition, sustainability, etc.).
