Microsoft has partnered with OpenAI - ChatGPT and released it under Copilot with improved data protection for organizations. Copilot does not store any data nor does Microsoft claim ownership of the output.

Graduate Professional Skills Certificate | Register for Fall 2024

The <u>Graduate Professional Skills Certificate</u> is an innovative, non-credit program for graduate students and postdoctoral fellows focusing on strengths-based professional skills development. The certificate program is offered at **no cost to graduate students and postdoctoral scholars** from all colleges and schools.

The certificate requires you to complete two courses and demonstrate evidence of building your professional skills. The courses should be taken either at the same time or in this order:

- 1. *GPS 984: Thinking Critically* This innovative, highly interactive, non-credit course provides a supportive and challenging setting for you to uncover and explore personal and professional beliefs and values as you candidly explore diverse issues with peers from various disciplines.
- 2. GPS 974: Graduate Professional Skills Certificate This is an umbrella course for the certificate that supports you with setting goals in alignment with with a recognized set of professional skills. You must register for GPS 974 to join the certificate program and remain registered until you complete your portfolio and perform a final demonstration of your skills.

Required courses are offered both online and in-person. Please register in the course format that best accommodates your schedule and learning style. To register, use the **Registration channel in PAWS**.

GPS 981: Academic Preparation for International Graduate Students | Register now!

Are you an international student new to USask? Registration is now open for **GPS 981**: Academic Preparation for International Graduate Students.

GPS 981 is a non-credit course designed to prepare international graduate students for the Canadian academic environment. Students will learn techniques for improving listening and note-taking skills; managing their reading loads; sharpening critical thinking; and conducting and managing research. Students will also learn about the role of supervisors, professors, and graduate chairs, and will gain practical institution in academic integrity.

Celebrating Indigenous Scholars | Ayicia Nabigon

Ayicia Nabigon is a M.Sc student in the Department of Biology from Biigtigong Nishnaabeg (formerly Ojibways of the Pic River First Nation), in Ontario.

After observing the moose population declining around her community, Ayicia wanted to learn more about the causes and effects of an



increasing population overlap with white-tailed deer. Her research is informed by concerns, questions, and feedback from Indigenous elders, youth, and hunters regarding food security and sovereignty, environmental change, and economic development in her study area.
