Data Management Plan (DMP) Creation Guide

Research data management (RDM) - the planning, maintenence, and documenting of data throughout the lifecycle of a research project - is a growing area of interest. Studies have found that as soon as a manuscript is published, the data underlying that <u>manuscript</u> <u>immediately starts to lose value</u>.

A data management plan (DMP) is a living document that is designed to help researchers plan how their data will be collected, documented, stored, preserved, and shared across the life-cycle of their research. DMPs are becoming essential tools for ensuring that research data is organized, protected, and preserved long term.

To help support the USask research community, Kevin Read (RDM & Open Science Librarian), has created a **Data Management Plan (DMP) Creation Guide** which can be used by faculty, staff, and students when developing their own DMPs.
