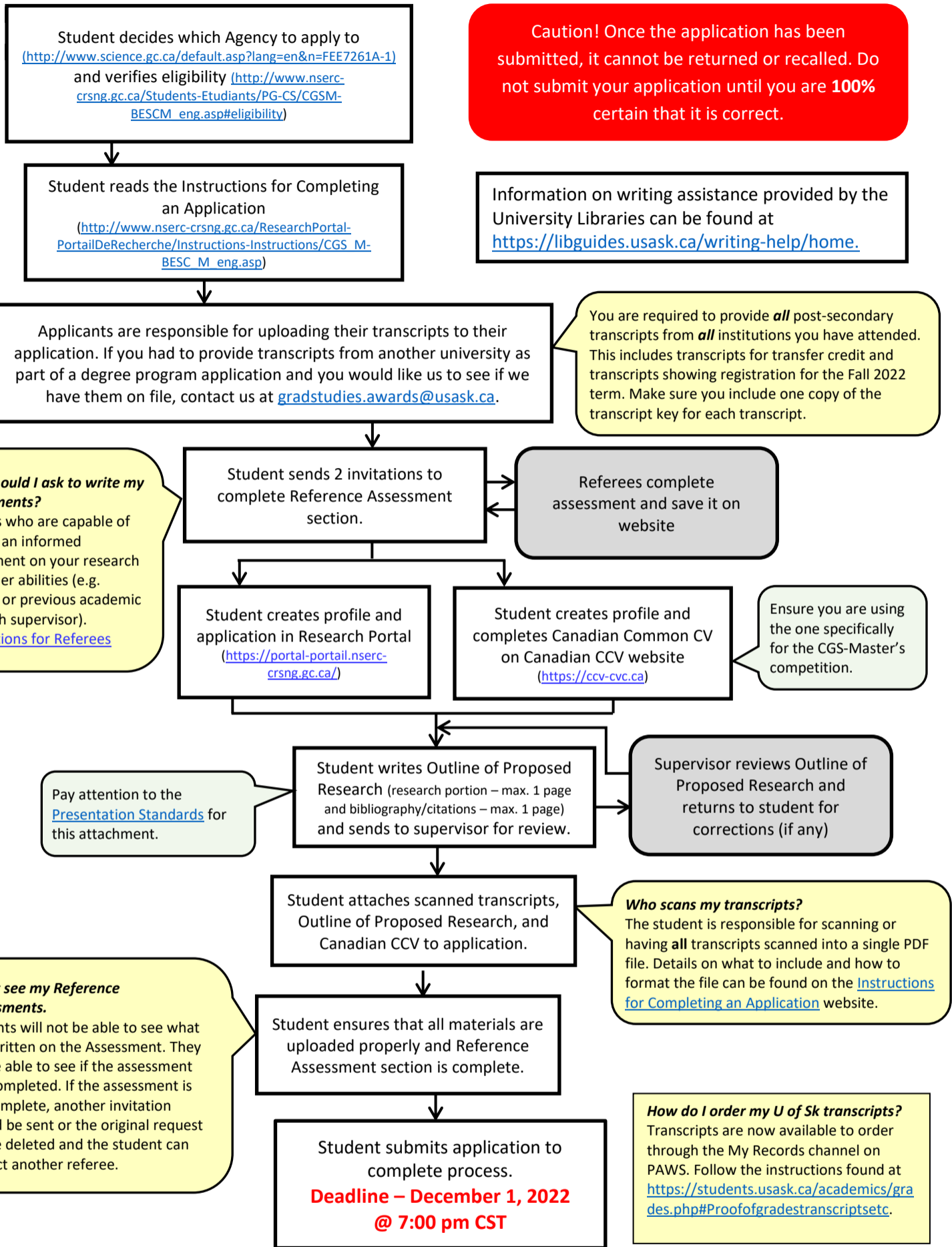


# CIHR/NSERC/SSHRC Canada Graduate Scholarship – Master’s Program Application Flow Chart

**What’s the difference between the Summary of Proposal and the Outline of Proposed Research?**  
Both are a description of your research. The *Summary of Proposal* must be written in language that is clear to members of the general public and is limited to 1500 **characters**. The *Outline of Proposed Research* is a more detailed description of your research. You should provide background information to position your proposed research within the context of the current knowledge in the field. You have a **maximum of one page** for the outline and a **maximum of one page** for the bibliography/citations. Anything beyond this will be disregarded by the adjudicating committee.
