CGPS Holiday Closure

CGPS Scholarship & Awards Update

As you know the [Reimagine Funding Proposal](#) passed at CGPS Council on October 27, 2022. With the Provost's full support, we are now ready to proceed with the changes as approved by CGPS Council.

In the *new Reimagine Graduate Funding model* centralized scholarship streams have changed.

Funding will be allocated directly to academic units (Departments) in the form of a Student Support Fund (SSF) and a 75th Anniversary Recruitment Scholarships. Allocations are based on graduate student enrollments (SSF) and student and faculty Tri-Agency scholarship and grant numbers (75th). **Allocation notices have been sent directly to academic units to help you plan for your 2023-24 cycles.**

What we used to call "*the Dean's*" now looks very different and is summarized below entitled **Dean's Doctoral Scholarship**

International

- [Deadline for applications – first Monday in February annually](#)
- No longer strictly a recruiting scholarship
- Entering and continuing international students can be nominated
- Nominated student must have completed no more than 24 months in their PhD program at the time of nomination; time in program is counted from the first term the nominee is registered in their 996
- The scholarship amount is \$24,000/year for two years

Domestic

- Deadline for applications – second Tuesday in October annually.
- Applicants must apply for the appropriate Tri-Agency Canada Graduate Scholarship-Doctoral (CGS-D) competition in October (follows the CGS-D deadline)
- Applications for this competition will be taken from those Tri-Agency CGS-D applications that are recommended to the national competition, but were not awarded at the national level
- The scholarship amount is \$24,000/year for two years

MyCreds Reminder

Confirmation of enrolment and confirmation of graduation documents are now issued through [MyCreds](#). Documents issued through MyCreds are secure, official and certified listings of a student's educational record and can be easily shared with anyone.

There is a cost to issue confirmation of enrolment and graduation documents through MyCreds. Each share credit costs \$10 (plus tax), is non-refundable and gives the requester 120 days to share the document an unlimited number of times. It is important to note that if enrolment/graduation information changes after the order is placed, the document will not be updated and a new document will need to be ordered and a new share credit paid for.

Training for Graduate Administrators – adding thesis titles

As of the Fall 2022 convocation cycle there were changes to the application to graduate process with the release of the Banner 9 Self Service Application to Graduate.

Graduate Administrators are now responsible for ensuring that all Master’s Thesis, Master’s Project, and PhD Thesis titles are accurately entered in Banner Student Admin during the convocation processing period and are correctly associated to the appropriate degree record. This data must be entered for each graduating student as it will appear on their official transcript.

Our colleagues in SIS have kindly agreed to offer a refresher training session prior to the next convocation cycle. This session will be held via Teams on April 4th at 9:00am.
