



Membership to the College of Graduate and Postdoctoral Studies (CGPS) is held for qualified individuals who are actively engaged in furthering the education, research, scholarly and artistic work of graduate students and postdoctoral scholars at the University of Saskatchewan. Membership to the CGPS faculty is for five years (July through June) and renewable for as long as the member remains in good standing and active in graduate and postdoctoral studies.

Graduate Faculty

Eligibility includes USask tenured, probationary, continuing term, emeriti, or in some circumstances academic programming appointments.

MD Graduate Faculty

Eligible members must be licensed Saskatchewan physicians or a Clinical PhD who holds a clinical appointment in the individual's respective health region as well as an academic appointment in a department or a division within the College of Medicine at USask. Adjunct Professor

Eligibility includes individuals whose knowledge, expertise and skills contribute to the academic unit's graduate student and postdoctoral scholar training, research, and teaching objectives. (Typically a tenure-track faculty member from a higher-ed institution.) The individual cannot receive remuneration and must not be an employee of USask. Adjunct professors may be eligible for library access, hold USask managed funding and/or be provided some IT services upon approval by the nominating academic unit.

Professional Affiliate

Professional Affiliates may be self-employed, may be employed in staff positions at USask, or may be members of external organizations. Professional affiliates cannot be research supervisors but are eligible to serve on graduate student advisory and examining committees and are able to teach graduate courses when their qualifications are appropriate.

Nominations for membership to CGPS must have the support of the head of the academic unit and the dean/executive director of the college/ school supporting the graduate program or postdoc training. Nominees must meet at least one of the following criteria (check all that apply).

The nominee has had previous experience supervising graduate students and/or has taught graduate-level course work in at least two of the last three years.

The nominee has conducted a peer review, or has had an article, book or exhibition of artistic work published or accepted for publication within the last three years.

The nominee has had substantial involvement in ongoing research which offers resources and opportunities for graduate students and/or postdoc scholars.
